GENERAL

Ms. D Kapot-Witbooi needs to complete two (2) additional unit standards of the MMC training and Mr Jacques Harmse is currently doing his MMC competency training. Staff members need to be trained internally on supply chain management.

On Wednesday, 16 February 2022, the Constitutional Court handed down judgement in the application for leave to appeal against a judgement and order of the Supreme Court of Appeal (SCA). Due to the interconnectedness of the regulations, the SCA declared the entire Procurement Regulations invalid.

The National- and Provincial Treasury has in the interim (whilst seeking guidance from the Court on the date of the invalidity of the regulations), provided guidance to organs of state. Due to the invalidity of the regulations the municipality's Preferential Procurement Policy has been revoked by Council and reference to the regulations were removed from the Supply Chain Management Policy. Draft Regulations were issued on 10 March 2022 and the closing date for comments is 11 April 2022.
